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## Homestead Exemption Application Due on or Before June 30

JUNE 10, 2024 (LINCOLN, NEB.) – The Nebraska Department of Revenue, Property Assessment Division (DOR) reminds property owners that the [Nebraska Homestead Exemption Application, Form 458](#) must be filed with their county assessor on or before **Friday, June 30, 2024**. For tax year 2024, June 30<sup>th</sup> is on a Sunday, which allows for protests to be filed in person or postmarked on Monday, July 1, 2024.

The homestead exemption provides relief from property taxes by exempting all or a portion of the taxable value of a property owner's primary residence. The State of Nebraska reimburses counties and other governmental subdivisions for the property taxes lost due to homestead exemptions.

In Nebraska, a homestead exemption is available to the following categories of property owners:

- Persons age 65 or older before January 1, 2024;
- Individuals with certain qualifying disabilities;
- Certain veterans with qualifying disability statuses and their surviving spouses;  
or
- Individuals with developmental disabilities.

Veterans who are 100% permanently disabled or the surviving spouse of such veteran, or a veteran who is 100% temporarily disabled who were approved for homestead exemption in the prior year are not required to file an annual homestead exemption application but are required to file a new application and a VA Certification in years ending in 0 or 5.

Some categories are subject to household income limitations and residence valuation requirements. The income limitations are on a sliding scale and depend on the

application category. Some categories require certifications from a medical provider, the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services, or the U.S. Department of Veteran Affairs. Please confirm what is required to be filed with your homestead exemption application.
